This park sits on the edge of the scenic Pitt River in north east Coquitlam. Park trails fan out from the large Quarry Road parking lot. From Lougheed Highway in Coquitlam, turn north on Coast Meridian and travel 2.5 km to Apel Drive. Signs will direct you to Victoria Drive. Follow Victoria Drive for 1 km to the crest of the hill and make a deliberate left turn to stay on Victoria. Travel northeast for 3.5 km to the park entrance on Quarry Road. To get to Minnekhada Lodge from Quarry Road, turn right on Gilley's Trail. Turn left onto Oliver Road which leads to the park and the lodge (parking is limited).
